4:10 p.m. - Mr. David Roberts - Noise By-Law and Petition from the Hamlet of Grafton Residents.

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**Re: Noise By-law No. 31-2001**

We, the residents of the Township of Alnwick/Haldimand, recently reviewed Noise By-law No. 31-2001 and were disappointed to find that the penalty for violating the by-law is a maximum of \$100. While we appreciate Council's attempt to regulate unwanted noise, the fact that the by-law provides for a maximum fine of only \$100 is of concern to us.

We believe that a \$100 fine is not a deterrent especially when it involves a repeat offender. In fact a repeat offender is more likely to treat the infraction as a nuisance. The Police or a Bylaw Enforcement Officer will be reluctant to invest substantial time and effort gathering evidence, processing paper work and attending Court knowing that upon conviction, the best they can hope for

is a token fine of \$100. Furthermore, a maximum fine of \$100 effectively handcuffs the Court particularly when dealing with repeat offenders. Accordingly we are asking Council to enact a noise by-law that provides for a maximum fine of \$10,000.

We recognize that a fine cannot be imposed unless the defendant pleads guilty or until a Court, after hearing evidence of the offence, is satisfied that an offence has been committed. Upon conviction the Court will decide whether or not to impose a suspended sentence (no fine) or impose some other monetary fine up to the maximum set out in the by-law.

We believe that a maximum fine of \$10,000 will go a long way in helping to protect victims of excessive noise. It would also be an effective tool for municipal staff and/or the Police when dealing with noise complaints they receive. For example, when a noise complaint is received the complainant, a Police Officer or local By-law Enforcement Officer could easily provide the alleged offender with a copy of the Noise By-law. This would be the first step in advising them of their obligations under the law.

Just knowing that a noise by-law carries a significant fine is often all that is needed to resolve most noise related disputes between neighbours. However, when dealing with a repeat offender, a significant fine imposed by the Courts will send a strong message that continually disturbing your neighbour(s) will not be tolerated.

In conclusion, Part III of the Municipal Act specifically Section 129, gives Council the authority to enact a noise by-law. Furthermore, Section 429 of the Municipal Act authorizes a municipality to establish a system of fines for offences under a by-law it enacts. Section 429(3) states:

*(3) The following rules apply to the system of fines:*

- 1. A minimum fine shall not exceed \$500 and a maximum fine shall not exceed \$100,000. However, a special fine may exceed \$100,000.*
- 2. In the case of a continuing offence, for each day or part of a day that the offence continues, a minimum fine shall not exceed \$500 and a maximum fine shall not exceed \$10,000. However, despite paragraph 1, the total of all of the daily fines for the offence is not limited to \$100,000.*
- 3. In the case of a multiple offence, for each offence included in the multiple offence, a minimum fine shall not exceed \$500 and a maximum fine shall not exceed \$10,000. However, despite paragraph 1, the total of all fines for each included offence is not limited to \$100,000. 2006, c. 32, Sched. A, s. 184.*

Furthermore, Section 433 of the Municipal Act provides that fines imposed are the property of the municipality. Section 433 states:

***433.** (1) Except as otherwise provided in this or any other Act, every fine imposed for a contravention of a by-law of a municipality or by-law of a local board of the municipality belongs to the municipality. 2006, c. 32, Sched. A, s. 184.*

It was noted by Mayor Finley that the Chief Building Official/By-Law Enforcement Officer has been requested to bring the existing Noise By-law to the next Regular Council Session for review and consideration.
